



## Max and Gladys Rothschild Scholarship Fund INFORMATION FOR APPLICANTS

### Eligibility for a Scholarship

Awards worth between £1,000 and £2,500 are offered to applicants who are following a **full-time final year undergraduate** or **postgraduate** course in Civil Engineering or the Sciences, at a UK university and who can demonstrate outstanding academic achievement, financial need and a clear financial plan. Preference will be given to Civil Engineering. The scholarships are for one academic year only.

### Your Application

Your application should include this form, your CV and your academic references. The final date for applications is the end of June each year.

### CV

Your CV (maximum length two A4 pages) to start from GCSE levels or equivalent without any gaps to your present course. Periods of part-time education, paid or voluntary work, should be included and details of involvement in the Jewish community.

### Relevant Financial Information

For each other grant or loan applied for, please indicate the current status of the application, the expected amount and the expected decision date. If your spouse/partner is also a student, details of his/her course should be given in section 8. If the costs of children e.g. childcare are included in section 4, the details should be given in section 8.

The scholarships awarded by BBUK range between £1000 and £2,500. You should explain in section 8 how you propose to deal with any shortfall in your income.

### Statement

An autobiographical statement. This should include your interests, participation within the Jewish community, your reasons for taking the proposed course, the reasons for being considered for a Rothschild Scholarship and if awarded what impact it would make on your future.

### Other Relevant Information

Any additional relevant information including details of any disability not included in the application form or CV and the detailed financial information requested above.

### References

Two current academic references from your university.

### Before an Award is Paid

Formal evidence from the university confirming your registration for the final year or postgraduate course for which you have applied for the award will be required before any payment is made.
